The book of Revelation was not given to confuse God's people, but to help them **see clearly**. It pulls back the curtain so believers can view life, suffering, worship, evil, and eternity from Heaven's perspective. – READ REVELATION 1:3

****Has the study of Revelation improved your vision? In what ways has our vision improved? How did the study help you to get back in the race, or to continue to run the race?

****Did this study improve the way you see Jesus?** Was my vision of Jesus too small? Do I worship Him as He truly is?

Many know Jesus as Savior, Teacher, or Friend—but Revelation shows Him as:

The risen Lord among His churches (1:12–20)

The Lion and the Lamb (5:5–6)

King of kings and Lord of lords (19:16)

The Alpha and Omega (22:13)

****Did this study help you to see the Church more clearly?**

Chapters 2–3 open our eyes to church, revealing that churches can appear healthy outwardly while struggling inwardly.

Jesus sees what others cannot see. How does Christ see my heart? Am I faithful, or only religious? Do you know religion or do I know Jesus?

****Compare your view of the world before and after the study?**

Revelation reminds us that earthly power is temporary. Empires rise and fall. Evil boasts loudly. Wealth dazzles. But none of it lasts. Babylon falls. The beast is defeated. The kingdoms of this world become Christ's kingdom.

What has captured my attention more than Christ? Am I living for what fades or what lasts?

****Has our vision concerning suffering changed?**

To human eyes, suffering looks like defeat. To Heaven, faithful suffering is victory.

The martyrs are honored. The saints overcome. Tears are not wasted. God has not lost control!

****How do we now have a clearer sight of eternity? Am I living with eternity in view?**
